

No Evil Shall Befall You

Psalm 91

Under His Wings;

- 1) We can trust God through trouble because He is the only One with complete sovereign control over all troubles
- 2) We can trust God through troubles because God will be with us in trouble

A promise to deliver from evil;
How? And for Who?

v. 7–8 - A great contrast between the outcome of the wicked and the righteous
Psalm 1

Proverbs 10:1 - a mother's heart is more grieved over a foolish son
Proverbs 10:2 - No amount of money can save a life/soul from death;
Proverbs 10:3 - righteousness is satisfying while sin causes more lust
Proverbs 10:4–5; 11; 12;

Heb 11:7 By faith Noah, being divinely warned of things not yet seen, moved with godly fear, prepared an ark for the saving of his household, by which he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness which is according to faith.

2Pe 2:6 and turning the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah into ashes, condemned them to destruction, making them an example to those who afterward would live ungodly;

Exo 14:13 And Moses said to the people, "Do not be afraid. Stand still, and see the salvation of the LORD, which He will accomplish for you today. For the Egyptians whom you see today, you shall see again no more forever.

2Sa 7:15–16 But My mercy shall not depart from him, as I took it from Saul, whom I removed from before you. And your house and your kingdom shall be established forever before you. Your throne shall be established forever." ' ' "

Proverbs 10:27–29

v. 9–10 - An absolute promise of preservation from evil;
Who does this verse apply to?

We have not always made the LORD our refuge; Most High our dwelling place
The people tested God - **Exodus 17:1–7**

- God is not to be tested, we are - "Is the LORD among us or not?"
- God does not owe anyone; A promise is not a debt

We tempt Christ when we say, "Lord give me what I thirst for."
We tempt Christ when we focus on the object of our thirst rather than Him
We tempt Christ when we doubt His ability to satisfy our thirst

v. 11–12 - this is the promise that Satan tempted Jesus with

Matthew 4:5–7

Satan tempted Jesus to prove that He was fully dependent upon God;
I'm just going to trust God - *I'm not going to take my medicine*
Let go and let God - *I'm going to just do this*; way we spend money; places we go;
People we hang out with; one we marry;
We need to go for it - *church/missionary spends the money trusting God for more*

Deu 6:16–17 "You shall not tempt the LORD your God as you tempted Him in Massah. You shall diligently keep the commandments of the LORD your God, His testimonies, and His statutes which He has commanded you.

Who is Jesus listening to? Who would He be obeying? SATAN (not His Father/Spirit)
Mat 16:22–23 Then Peter took Him aside and began to rebuke Him, saying, "Far be it from You, Lord; this shall not happen to You!" But He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind Me, Satan! You are an offense to Me, for you are not mindful of the things of God, but the things of men."

Who's will would Jesus follow? His own (independent from the Father) or subject to His Father
Mar 14:36 And He said, "Abba, Father, all things are possible for You. Take this cup away from Me; nevertheless, not what I will, but what You will."

Luk 24:26 Ought not the Christ to have suffered these things and to enter into His glory?"

Luk 24:46 Then He said to them, "Thus it is written, and thus it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead the third day,

Radical Obedience: Whose voice will you listen to? People/Peter; Still small voice

Mat 27:40 and saying, "You who destroy the temple and build it in three days, save Yourself! If You are the Son of God, come down from the cross."

Joh 10:18 No one takes it from Me, but I lay it down of Myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This command I have received from My Father."

Rom 5:19 For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so also by one Man's obedience many will be made righteous.

God did give Jesus the final victory! He delivered Him from the most terrifying and powerful enemy there ever was... Death (sin & Satan)

Heb 10:12 But this Man, after He had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down at the right hand of God,

Eph 1:20–22 which He worked in Christ when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places, far above all principality and power and might and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in that which is to come. And He put all things under His feet,

Psa 110:1 A Psalm of David. The LORD said to my Lord, "Sit at My right hand, Till I make Your enemies Your footstool."

The promises of Psalm 91 are fulfilled in Christ

v. 15–16 - Call upon Jesus to save you and fulfill Psalm 91 in your life!
